Middle School Program

San Miguel School has designed a holistic wraparound approach to student learning that begins with building a relationship with each student and teaching them how to be accountable for their own actions. Students are provided with individualized supports that allow them to take advantage of the full three year Middle School program at San Miguel School. Students enrolled at the beginning of 6^{th} grade who graduate in the 8^{th} grade. During their 3 years together, 2 students moved to new schools at the end of 6^{th} grade. At the start of the 7^{th} grade, 2 students filled those open spots and then graduated with the class.






8th Grade Academic Accomplishments:

High School Selection and Awards:

This year 30 students graduated as members of the San Miguel School Class of 2015.

- 16 students qualified and took the Chicago Public Schools Selective Enrollment Exam and 7 students took the Catholic High School Entrance Exam.
- 5 students were selected to receive scholarships from competitive scholarship programs including the Daniel Murphy, High Sight, Clark and HFS Scholarship programs.



Graduate Support Program

This program provides academic support, youth development activities, leadership opportunities, financial assistance, alumni events and college readiness to high school age graduates of San Miguel Middle School. This year 102 alumni were served in this program in 9th through 12th grades. The following statistics describe the seniors in high school served by the program.

San Miguel Graduates—96% (In 4 years)


<u>CPS District wide (2014)</u> —69.4% (In 5 years)

In 2011, 26 students graduated from the 8th grade at San Miguel School.

As of July 2015:

- 96% of the San Miguel Class of 2011 Graduated from high school in 4 years or less
- Of this group 10 students graduated from Charter Schools, 4 from Selective Enrollment High Schools, 3 from Public High Schools, and 6 from Catholic High Schools.

Many students in this group will continue their education beyond high school. From this class, 24 students were accepted into 4-Year Universities and Community Colleges.

Middle School Support

In addition to providing programming and support to our graduates in high school, the graduate support staff works in collaboration with the 8^{th} grade teachers to assist our 8^{th} grade students and their families during the high school selection process. Through the school year, they coordinated, organized, and provided:

- All 8th grade students visited or went on 3 high school shadow days to schools of their choice. Schools included De La Salle Institute, Holy Trinity, Perspectives Charter School, Back of the Yards Neighborhood College Preparatory High School, Cristo Rey Jesuit High School, St. Laurence High School, Brother Rice High School, St. Rita High School, Chicago Hope Academy, Josephinum High School, Our Lady of Tepeyac High School, and St. Ignatius College Prep.
- Parent and Student Workshops that included topics like the Types of High Schools in Chicago, the Selective Enrollment Process, Scholarship Application Procedures, and Charter School Open Houses
- Assistance with writing scholarship and high school applications and essays.



Family Support Program and Parent Participation

The Family Support Program provides educational opportunities for parents/adults, clinical counseling for students/families and collaboration and community development with other Back of the Yards neighborhood organizations.

Approximately **550** individual family members were served this past year including some members from the community at-large.

This year **81% of middle school families** participated in at least one Family Support workshop or event.
