Dear Donors and Friends:

People often ask, what makes San Miguel special? What makes the model work? What is the secret sauce? Many aspiring educators, universities and institutions around the country visit San Miguel School to learn this and to discover the "secret sauce."

People want to know how our students continuously defy the odds. They want to know how students enter San Miguel on the path to dropping out of high school yet 100% of San Miguel students go on to high performing high schools, 98% graduate high school, 92% go on to college, and San Miguel students improve 4-6 grade levels in just three years!

To discover the "secret sauce" people look at our curriculum, teacher to student ratio, the layout of the school year and school day, the extended programs such as graduate support and family support programs, and the parent partnership. They study our attention to reading and educating students labeled as ESL students.

While all these things are important to the overall success of our program they are NOT the "secret sauce" which makes San Miguel School highly effective.

Our mission statement – *Transforming students, their families, and Communities by touching hearts and inspiring minds* – includes this *secret sauce*. While this concept of touching hearts and inspiring minds might seem intangible or at times clichéd – we have often thought about changing the wording so that it is more "concrete" - to our students it is very tangible. Simply put, **touching hearts** IS the "secret sauce" and we are okay with EVERYONE knowing this secret.

When our students see volunteers, donors, and supporters—people they do not even know — work to make San Miguel possible they feel loved and receive a sense of dignity. They grow up to be young adults who understand the concept of generosity, community, and helping others.

Our students see the love of Christ in YOU! This love fosters HOPE which cannot be taught in a text book, online or through a math problem.
